Nano Nagle opened her first school in Cork in 1754. In setting up schools she challenged the institutional injustice that perpetuated marginalisation and poverty. In keeping with that ideal, Presentation schools promote a faith community inspired by Gospel values and a holistic response to the spiritual, moral, social, intellectual and physical needs of each student.

CEIST (Catholic Education, an Irish Schools Trust), our governing body aims to maintain this ethos by providing a new moral and legal trustee framework to enable their schools to continue to offer post-primary Catholic education into the future as a viable option and as an integral part of the Irish school system.

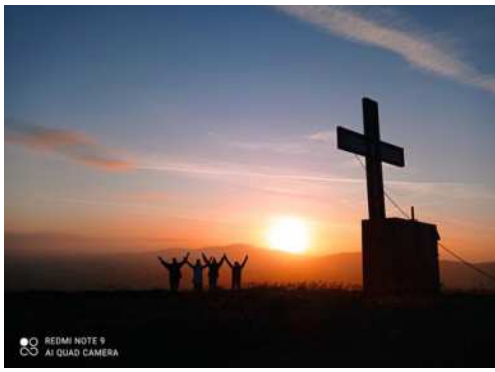

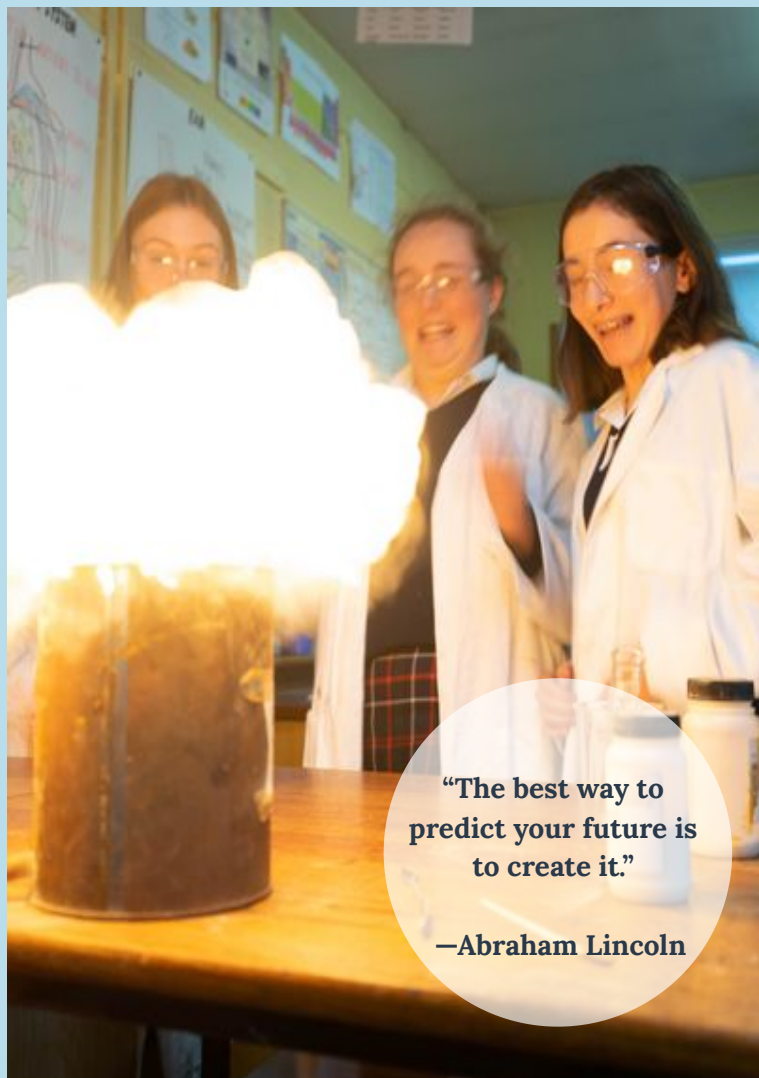

Leaving Certificate Applied

The LCA is a distinct, self-contained, two-year Leaving Certificate Programme aimed at preparing learners for adult and working life. It emphasises forms of achievement and excellence which the established Leaving Certificate has not recognised in the past and offers specific opportunities to students to prepare for and progress on to further education at third level and the working world.

Incoming 1st Year Student Supports

Each First Year class is assigned a Class Tutor. The assigned teacher will take on a pastoral role-keeping in close contact with the class to ensure that the students are settling in to their new environment and that the class works well together. There is also a Year Head who looks after the whole year group and makes contact with parents when required. The Year Head works closely with the Class Tutor to make each students' experience of life at Presentation Kilkenny a productive and fulfilling one. In addition we also operate a First Year Muintearas Programme to help aid the students' transition into second-level education.

Features of our 1st Year Muintearas Programme:

- Open-Night for prospective parent & students to visit our school and meet our teachers & students
- Parent information talks pre and post entry
- Dedicated induction days at the start of the year
- Le Chéile- 6th Year students who act as mentors for 1st Year students and meet them every Monday to offer support and guidance
- Meitheal- An after school Learning Together Club
- Team-building activities
- Academic assessments to identify students who require additional support



Student Support and Pastoral Care

Additional Educational Needs Support

The school uses the resources provided by the Department of Education and Skills to make provision for students with additional educational needs. The AEN Team in Presentation Kilkenny is committed to providing a comprehensive and effective learning support service for students to enable them to achieve their full potential. In some instances, 'Team Teaching' helps students in the classroom while some students are withdrawn for additional support. Special Needs Assistants offer supports to individual students and are an important part of the Learning Support Team. A key cornerstone of the success of our AEN department is the trusting relationships built up with all the stakeholders, students, parents, teachers and the AEN team. All of our work in the AEN department is done in consultation with parents and student to achieve the best outcomes for the learner.

Mental health, self-esteem, positivity and encouragement underpin all aspects of school life.

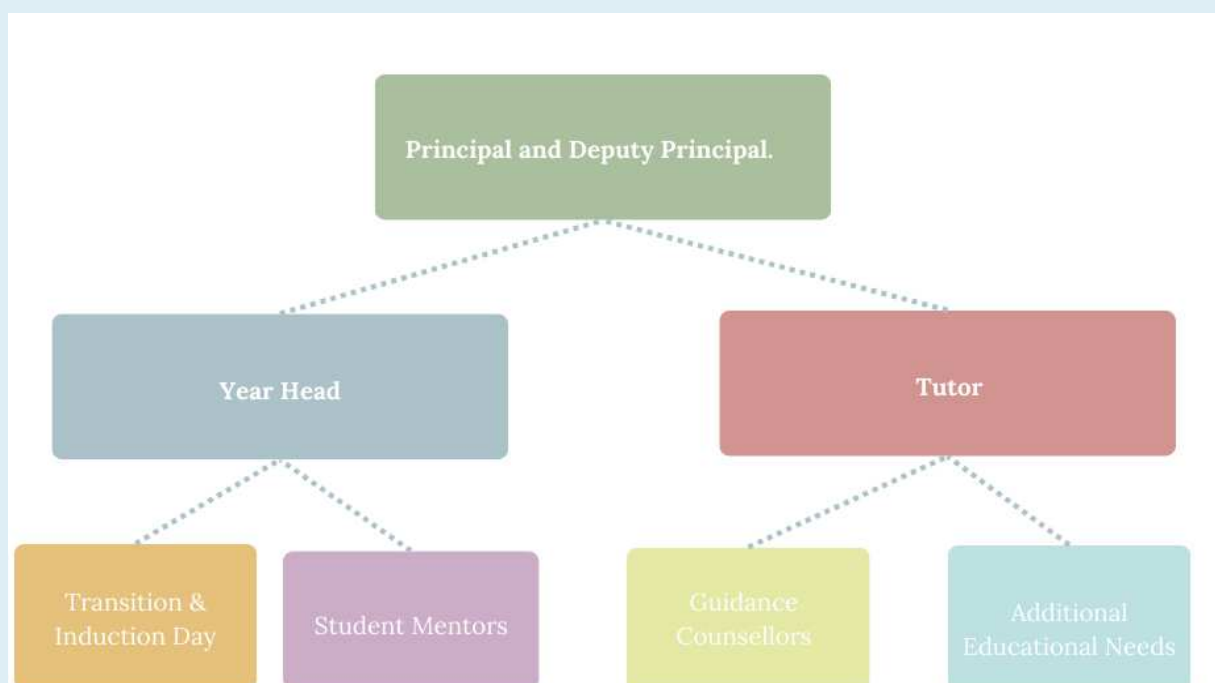

- Fundraising for local and national charities

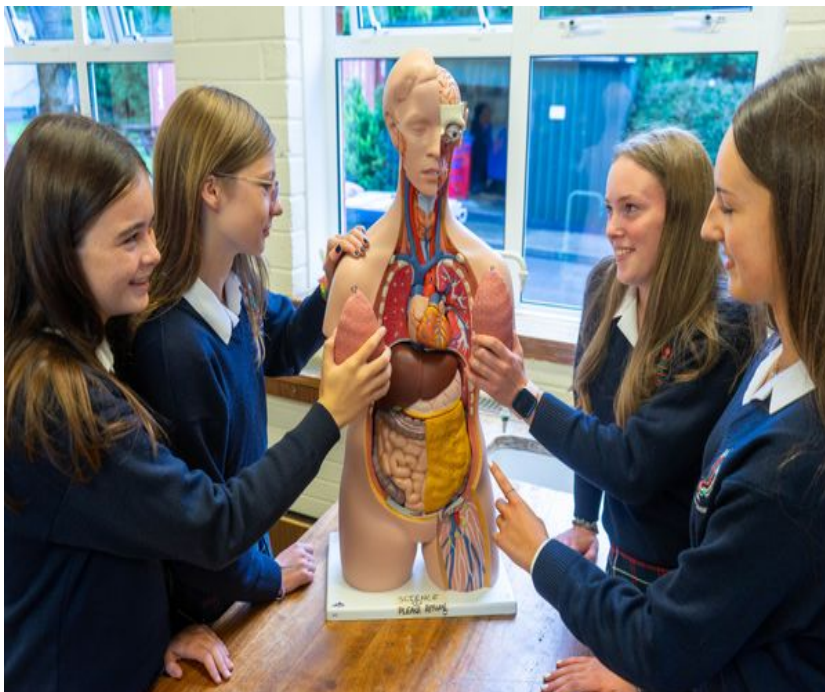

Music Generation

Music Generation is Ireland's national music education programme, co-funded by U2 and the Department of Education and Skills. Its mission is to create inspiring experiences for children and young people through music. We are delighted as a school to be part of Music Generation Kilkenny which enables us to offer small group music tuition to students at a reduced cost during their weekly school timetable.

Singing Tuition

We offer one to one singing lessons in our school. Our esteemed vocal coach, with exceptional expertise and experience can prepare students for music practical exams, the Royal Irish Academy Classical Vocal exams and the Royal Irish Academy Musical Theatre exams. Tuition focuses on vocal technique, developing repertoire, building confidence and performance skill. Lessons take place on a rotational basis throughout the school timetabled classes.



Choirs

Every student in Presentation, Kilkenny will get the opportunity to gain confidence through artistic performance in Junior Cycle. In addition, the school has both a junior and senior choirs who enter into many national choral competitions. We have enjoyed successes in many events including the Sligo Choral Festival, the Wesley Inter Schools Music Festival, the Feis Ceoil and more locally the Kilkenny Choral Festival. Our school even had the opportunity to perform in the past in Britain's Got Talent competition.

Technology in Teaching & Learning

We are a Tradigital School; all teachers are equipped with a Microsoft Surface device in addition to classrooms having WIFI enabled data projectors. 150 student devices are available throughout each day ensuring teaching and learning can be facilitated using ICT. All teachers receive regular professional development in relation to incorporating digital learning into their teaching methodologies and assessment strategies.

ICT Integration

- Information Communication Technology (ICT) is used in Presentation Kilkenny to enhance the learning experience for all. We aim to prepare your child for the ever-changing environment in which they live and in which they will work in the future
- Various software, apps and technology devices are used to support student learning across all curricula
- Students use devices simultaneously with physical textbooks to avail of the benefits of both learning styles
- We are proud users of G Suite for Education. Students receive free access to the following Google products- Drive, Docs, Sheets, Slides, Forms, Gmail and Calendar. These platforms assist us in providing a modern classroom experience for students.



We recently launched the Primary School Technology & Science Outreach Programme whereby our Transition Year students visit local primary schools, introducing and providing students with the opportunity to explore technology and science related concepts that they will be exposed to in secondary school.

Guidance

Career Guidance and Counselling is at the heart of our Pastoral Care System at Presentation Kilkenny. Our Guidance Counsellors have a caring and supportive role in the school where students can get advice and supports about a range of issues. From personal issues to study skills to college advice and information, the Guidance Counsellors are on hand to meet with students in a confidential environment where they can be cared for and supported throughout their time in the school.

Counselling helps students explore their thoughts, feelings and the choices open to them. It gives care and support to students learning to cope with the many aspects of growing up and school life within their personal circumstances. Presentation Kilkenny endeavours to offer guidance to all our students. The Guidance Team liaises with Year Heads, Class Teachers, Learning Support Teachers, Subject Teachers, Deputy Principal and the Principal. They also have regular contact with parents, psychologists, employers, colleges, social services, counsellors and the Department of Education.

The Career Guidance and Counselling Department within Presentation Kilkenny provides support for all students in three main areas:

- **Personal and Social Guidance**
- **Educational Guidance**
- **Career and Vocational Guidance.**

Wellbeing will cross the three years of junior cycle and build on substantial work already taking place in schools in support of students' wellbeing. The Benefits of having a Therapy Dog in School

Boosted Self-Esteem and Positive Interactions: Alfie will help foster stronger connections between students and staff, enhancing confidence and social interactions.

Improved Physical Well-Being: Alfie's presence can reduce blood pressure while encouraging physical engagement and movement.

Enhanced Cognitive Abilities: Working with a therapy dog has been shown to boost memory and problem-solving skills.

Elevated Mood and Social Comfort: Alfie will help create a calming environment, encouraging openness and easing social interactions.

Improved Reading Skills: Studies show that students improve their reading abilities when reading to a non-judgmental, supportive audience—like a therapy dog.

More Information about Alfie

Alfie has a non-shedding, hypoallergenic coat, making him a great fit for students with allergies.

Interaction with Alfie will be optional, respecting those who may be uncomfortable around dogs. Research shows that therapy dog interactions can even reduce fear of animals over time.

Alfie will always be on a leash while on school grounds and will not roam freely. We have trained handlers in the building to supervise him, and Alfie will follow his own carefully planned timetable!
